- We've celebrated Thanksgiving in Canada for
- 140 years, starting in November 6, 1879.
- Prior to 1957, Canada celebrated Thanksgiving on the 3rd Monday of Oct. It officially moved to the second Monday of Oct via an announcement on January 31, 1957 by the Governor General of Canada.
- During Thanksgiving 2020, <u>2.5 million whole</u> <u>turkeys</u> were purchased by Canadians, equal to 36% of all whole turkeys that were sold over the year.
